Amish Paste		Amish Paste tomatoes are an acorn-shaped, deep-red, paste-type fruit. The vines produce medium-sized, 8 to 12ounce fruit. This Amish heirloom has thick flesh and few seeds.	5	\$4
Brandywine		The Brandywine tomato plant is an heirloom cultivar, with large potato-leaved foliage and which bears large pink beefsteak-shaped fruit, popularly considered among the best tasting available.	4	\$4
Carmello		This outstanding main-season French hybrid yields abundant, juicy, 5- to 7- ounce, medium-large orange red tomatoes with rich, sweet flavor. Rarely seen in shops due to their thin yet non-cracking skin, which prevents travel, Carmello is disease-resistant and appreciates support for its strong indeterminate plants.	3	\$4
Cherokee Carbon		A cross of Cherokee Purple and Carbon tomatoes, considered "black" tomatoes. These deeply purple beefsteak-type tomatoes have a dusky blush and rich, winey, complex flavor. The bulky, slightly squat fruit average 12 to 15 ounces each.	3	\$4

Early Girl		<p>The Early Girl tomato is a medium-sized globe-type F1 hybrid, ripens early, and is reliable and prolific. Its indeterminate growth, requires support.</p>	4	\$4
Gold Medal		<p>Gold Medal. Large, yellow streaked with red. The 1-pound fruit are among the smoothest, bi-colored tomatoes available and are one of the most beautiful. Yellow fruit are blushing with rosy red that radiates from the blossom end. Lovely! The firm flesh is of superior quality, being sweet and mild.</p>	2	\$4
Legend		<p>Legend tomatoes are perfect to grow in containers or in the ground. This wonderful early red tomato has fantastic balanced acidic/sweet flavor. The determinate Legend tomato plant is hearty and produces tasty tomatoes in great abundance on a well-behaved plant.</p>	3	\$4
Matina		<p>Early maturing plant produces good yields of 2 to 4 oz red tomatoes. The taste is so good and it normally wouldn't be found in huge beefsteak varieties. Perfect for canning, salads, salsa, slicing, sandwiches, and sauce. The fact is that it ripens up to a full month earlier than many beefsteak varieties.</p>	5	\$4
Momotara		<p>One of the most popular tomato varieties in Japanese markets and for good reason. Its flavor is an intricate and harmonious combination of sweet and tangy that has won Momotaro several tomato tasting contests. The radiant pink slicers weigh 6–7 ounces. Momotaro is durable, heat tolerant, and crack resistant with good storability.</p>	3	\$4

Opalka Paste		Fruits are far richer and more flavorful than most paste tomatoes . A long, pepper-shaped type with fruits that grow to 4 to 6" long, clustered in groups of 2 to 5. So sweet and refreshing, it can be eaten straight off the vine, but is highly prized for sauces and canning. Indeterminate plant.	2	\$4
Sun Gold—limit one per customer for first order		An indeterminate, hybrid variety with the best flavor you've ever had in a cherry tomato. Considered one of the most popular cherry tomatoes because of its production and flavor. Fruits grow in huge clusters that average 10-15 fruits per cluster.	28	\$5
Sweet Million		A vigorous grower, indeterminate. Generally described as cherry tomatoes but in fact their size varies from just smaller than an average cherry tomato to golf ball size. The fruits are bright red and very glossy. They taste of a good mix of sweetness / acidity.	9	\$4


