RE-OPENING UPDATE

At its August 24th monthly meeting, the Staff Leadership Team and the Board of Trustees discussed the continued surge of the Delta Variant, the results from both Reopening Surveys, conversations with members, information from a medical professional in our congregation, and the site CovidActNow.org. We discussed various activities and have made the following decisions: *Based on this information, the Board and SLT recommend we not open in September for In-person worship.* We also note, medical experts do not expect the surge to reverse before October. Expressed another way, it's unknown how long this surge will last, but it almost certainly is going to get worse over the next month. *Because of this, there will be no large in-person indoor events until further notice.* This does NOT mean we are closing!
