

FSUC NEWS

2022 Church Goals: At its October 25 meeting, the Board of Trustees endorsed adoption of three major church goals for 2023. In accordance with our Policies, the goals must be presented to the congregation for comment before the Board can consider final approval. You can find them on the website, esuc.org.

Congregational Meeting: Sunday, December 4, 11:30 am (Multiplatform): Mark your calendars and plan to join on Sunday, December 4, following worship. We will be voting on membership bylaw changes and for the 2023 budget. This is needed after the vote to change fiscal years.

Help Create AfterCare Kits: Your Women's Perspective Ministry Team has been working to develop action items to address the reproductive injustices that are resulting from the overturning of Roe V Wade. There are bins in the foyer to collect requested items for AfterCare Kits for women receiving abortions: Overnight maxipads, Disposable or home made heating pads, Chux (bed pads), Fluffy socks, Graham crackers, granola bars, Chocolate, Herbal and other teas, Lip balm, Advil/Tylenol/Emergen-C, Hand written notes of affirmation and support, Medium size paper or fabric gift bags.
