Variety	Photo	Description
Amish Paste		85 days. Amish Paste tomatoes are an acorn-shaped, deep-red, fruit great for making tomato sauce. This heirloom indeterminate produces medium to large-sized, 8 to 12ounce fruit with thick flesh and few seeds. Matures later in the summer. Plant needs good support.
Beaverlodge NEW		55 days. One of the earliest maturing varieties. Plants are loaded with tomatoes. These extremely compact determinate plants tend to creep rather than grow tall-perfect for hanging basket or patio container. Rich and balanced flavorful 2 ½ inch long, plum-shaped fruit. Great combo of earliness, productivity and quality.
Bobcat NEW		68 days. Picture-perfect, smooth-skinned fruit with firm, meaty, gloriously red flesh and classic tomato shape. These impressive 1-ouncer slicers load heavily on powerful, strapping determinate plants. Quick to mature, you can enjoy Bobcat earlier than most other varieties of this type.

<p>Early Girl</p>		<p>57 days. The Early Girl tomato is a medium-sized globe-type F1 hybrid, ripens early, and is reliable and prolific. Its indeterminate growth, requires support.</p>
<p>Early Girl Bush NEW</p>		<p>54 days. A compact bush version of Early Girl but even earlier, with bigger yields and larger, globe-shaped fruits. Fruits are 4 in. across, weigh 5 to 7 oz., yet still deliver all the same desirable characteristics as Early Girl. Determinate.</p>
<p>Emmy Lou NEW</p>		<p>75 days. A superstar in the garden, this early ripening slicer produces superior- quality, extra-large red fruit with a delicious, juicy flavor. Determinate plants set very heavy harvests and keep producing. Expect only excellence as the plants perform even in low input conditions.</p>
<p>Fakel NEW</p>		<p>75 days. This productive compact bush makes a good stand of flame red, 3.5 " slightly oblong tomatoes with an excellent flavor and texture. Multi-purpose Fakel holds well after harvest and is a good choice for packing in newspaper and holding in a cool spot.</p>

<p>Galahad</p>		<p>73 days. Medium size, dark red beefsteak type, blight and crack resistant, lasts well into fall, prolific and sweet.</p>
<p>Gold Medal</p>		<p>80 days. Large, 1+-pound yellow streaked with red are among the smoothest, bi-colored tomatoes available and are one of the most beautiful. Firm flesh superior quality, sweet and mild. Ripe later in the summer. Plants needs support.</p>
<p>Legend</p>		<p>68 days. Legend tomatoes are perfect to grow in containers or in the ground. This wonderful early red tomato has fantastic balanced acidic/sweet flavor. The determinate Legend tomato plant is hearty and produces tasty tomatoes in great abundance on a well-behaved plant.</p>
<p>Luther Burbank NEW</p>		<p>75 days. Developed by Luther Burbank around 1915. Determinate and fairly early, a heavy yielder of majestic 3-4 inch fruit. Very deep red color and traditional bold tomato flavor. The only variety that Mr. Burbank raised for canning. Disease resistant.</p>
<p>Oregon Spring NEW</p>		<p>65-70 days. This determinate variety was developed at Oregon State University to produce incredibly early yields of oval tomatoes even in cooler weather.</p>

<p>San Marzano Paste</p>		<p>80 days. HEIRLOOM. Almost no seed cavities—all meat.</p> <p>Compared to the Roma tomato, San Marzano tomatoes are longer, thinner and more pointed. The flesh is much thicker with fewer seeds, and the taste is stronger, sweeter, and less acidic. Ripens later in summer. Needs support.</p>
<p>Siletz</p>		<p>70-75 days One of the most reliable slicing tomatoes you can grow. Coming in early with a nice flush 4-5-inch, deep red fruit that weighs from 7-10 ounces. The flavor packed red tomatoes are nearly seedless. Expect several bursts of ripe tomatoes as the season progresses. Vigorous 2-3- foot plants.</p>
<p>Sun Gold—limit one.</p>		<p>65 days. An indeterminate, hybrid variety with the best flavor you've ever had in a cherry tomato. Considered one of the most popular cherry tomatoes because of its early fruit, high production and flavor. Fruits grow in huge clusters. Plant needs support.</p>
<p>Sweet Million</p>		<p>65-75 days. A vigorous grower, which needs support. Varies from just smaller than an average cherry tomato to golf ball size. The fruits are bright red and very glossy. Good mix of sweet/acid taste.</p>
<p>Willamette</p>		<p>70 days determinate. Crack resistant, medium size tomatoes are meaty, smooth and solid, mild flavored. The upright plants do not require staking. Good production in spite of false springs, late chills, damp or dry summers.</p>
